As you know, on June 19 Orlando was host to an incomprehensible act of violence and cruelty. It boggles the mind how one man can hold so much loathing for other people to actually do such a thing. Imagining the horror of the people at the club and the grief of the families is beyond words to describe. We go about our business, because it hurts too much, or because we have become numb to violence in the news. It is hard even to pray. Yet pray we must. We pray for those lives taken, those families morning. We pray for the authorities in their work trying to protect us all.

Like you, I hope that ways may be found to identify the various causes and enablers of such terrible violence which so deeply scars our society, without giving up our values. I have many stirrings. I wonder about how we might better track or monitor persons with mental illness, who are prone to violence. I ponder how to improve security in public places. I ponder why gay persons are now afraid to move and associate like anyone else. I seek to understand the varieties of proper Islamic preaching in America, which has lost control of some young Muslims, who are unduly influenced by foreign, extremist ideas on the internet. I seek to better understand the role of guns in American homes.

I ask you to learn, too. Television is normally too simplistic because there is not enough time to process complex issues. Rather, read widely on these subjects, and not only the writers you normally agree with. Tell me what you learn. See you in worship.

### 2016 Summer Capital Campaign

### Register Now for Sunday School & Confirmation Classes

Sunday School classes meet on Sunday mornings from 9am to 10am, this is by design to coincide with our 9am worship service. Kids and families get the most out of their Sunday School experience when parents go to church while kids are in class. That's because we use a lectionary curriculum, which means that the kids are learning the same lesson that's read and preached about in church. Talking about it with parents on the way home or over lunch, helps kids grow in their faith even more!

At St. David's we begin Christian instruction at age two—our littlest learners quickly know that Jesus loves them! In the preschool room, kids age two to four have circle time for the Bible story, say grace together at snack time, color, make crafts, sing, play, and pray together.

Elementary school kids (grades K-5) study a Bible story each week and make connections to their lives. Teachers use learner leaflets, coloring, crafts, and games to engage kids in the material. Kids also learn the Lord's Prayer, the Ten Commandments, the Apostle's Creed, and more.

Learning how to worship is important, too, so each week we begin with a large group opening in "Children's Church" up in the old nave. Kids help light candles, read, collect offering, and participate in a short (about 15 minutes long) kid-friendly service. The highlight is Pastor's weekly visit to share the Word with the kids. And there's always singing!

Sunday School kids also participate in our annual Christmas Pageant Play which lets them step right into the story of the birth of Jesus.

Fifth graders are asked to attend three additional sessions on Saturdays in the spring to prepare to receive their first Holy Communion (which will be scheduled on or near Pentecost).

### Rally Day, and the first day of Sunday School, is September 11, starting at 9am.

Beginning in grade 6, kids attend Confirmation class on Wednesday evenings from 6:30 to 8:00pm. In addition to learning, confirmation kids get involved with the life of the church as acolytes, assistant teachers in Sunday School, and more. Kids are also strongly encouraged to attend is the annual confirmation retreat at Camp Herrlich (scheduled this year for September 23-25), a long-time favorite event. Traditionally, kids make their confirmation at St. David's in November of ninth grade.

You don't have to be a member of the church to enroll your child in our Christian Education program. Please register now for the 2016-2017 school year.

### Five Tips for bringing young children to worship

Sit up in the front. Yes, that's right, little kids like to see what's going on, they are awed by the candles, the organ, the sign language, and more. Each sumer week, Pastor Arden will have a special message for the children.

- > Even the preschool kids learn the Lord's Prayer in Sunday School, so encourage them to join in that part of the service.
- ➤ Pick up a rainbow bag in the narthex, so they will have some Christian coloring pages and activities to help pass the time.
- ➤ Be sure to get a large print bulletin and show them how to follow along. Go ahead and let them color in the margins.
- > Use the quiet room in the back if you need a break, maybe borrowing a toy to bring back inside for the rest of the service.
